Congregation: Most merciful God, we confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. 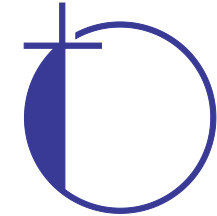
